Making a Difference Friday

We have restarted our Making a Difference Friday, which currently is running fortnightly on a Friday afternoon. We have three groups which are Pupil Council, Eco Schools, and Rights Respecting Schools. Each of the houses Balandro, Benholm and Brotherton will spend a term (terms 1 and 2 will be combined to make one session) working in each group making decisions and improvements to benefit the school. This allows our pupils to learn about making important decisions to develop skills for life and work such as effective communication and understanding other peoples' points of view. Through learner participation groups we aim to improve:

- Relationships between the staff and children
- Improve wellbeing
- Develop a better school ethos where all contributions are valued
- Develop a greater sense of shared community
- Improved engagement
- Improved attainment and achievement

Pupil Council

ECO Schools



The Eco schools programme aims to rally and unite children to make realistic but dynamic change, creating positive impacts for our planet.

Mrs Kydd and Balandro are conducting an audit of the whole school to decide which area of sustainability to improve first. Once they have collated their data the group will draw up an action plan for us all to follow.

Rights Respecting Schools



This group are putting children's rights at the heart of Johnshaven School. The work they do will embed the rights of the child in daily school life and will give our children the best chance to lead happy, healthy lives and to be responsible, active citizens.

Mrs Grant and Brotherton are learning about the difference between needs and wants and understanding what basic rights are essential to thrive in a modern world.
